Welcome

Welcome to your child's final term in Year 6 and at Lawley! The summer term promises to be very busy with the upcoming SATs assessments followed by our residential trip to Stokes Barn, transition meetings with the new secondary schools as well as sports day, a trip to Crucial Crew, leavers' fun events and our leavers' assembly. Reading

Children will be allocated a school reading scheme book if required and/or they are expected to have their own choice of book in school each day (if they are a free reader).

As part of their weekly homework, children should still be reading to an adult at home and having their online diary updated regularly during the week. Reading records are regularly checked in school to make sure they are being updated. It is still very important to read with your child even if they are now able to read confidently.

Homework

Weekly homework will continue up until the SATs assessments in May. After that, there will be no formal requirement for homework however your child will have access to SATs Companion for the remainder of their time at Lawley and are free to access it for revision purposes should you wish. Until this time, we expect all pupils to be using the platform each week to work through the tasks set as a minimum.

PE

PE days in Year 6 can vary. You will be kept up to date with this via email. Please ensure your child comes to school wearing the correct PE kit or active uniform.

Trips

As previously mentioned, our residential trip this year will be to Stokes Barn in Much Wenlock from 18th – 22nd May 2026.

We will also be attending the annual Crucial Crew trip which is specifically for Year 6 pupils and focuses on areas such as health, safety, stranger danger and wellbeing.
